

- Training Topics
 - Week 1- Crews received training on proper techniques and considerations to utilize while advancing hose lines into structures.
 - Week 2- Crews continued from week one and advanced their skills utilizing larger diameter hose lines and new techniques.
 - Week 3- Crews worked on calculations and pumping the hose lines as well as fire engine hose, nozzles and appliances.
 - Week 4- Crews participated in the mandatory OSHA consumption drill. While OSHA requires a simple consumption drill, our Fitness Committee has gone to great lengths to simulate fire ground activities. The committee has also worked throughout the year to ensure our crews are physically ready to be on the fire ground which in turn has led to almost everyone seeing improvements from the previous year. All members are required to complete, including the Chief and Deputy Chief!!


