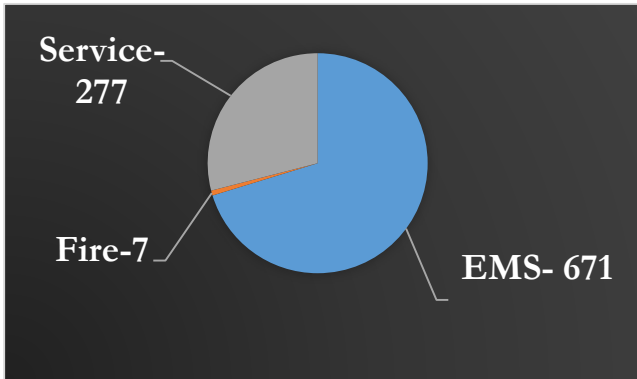




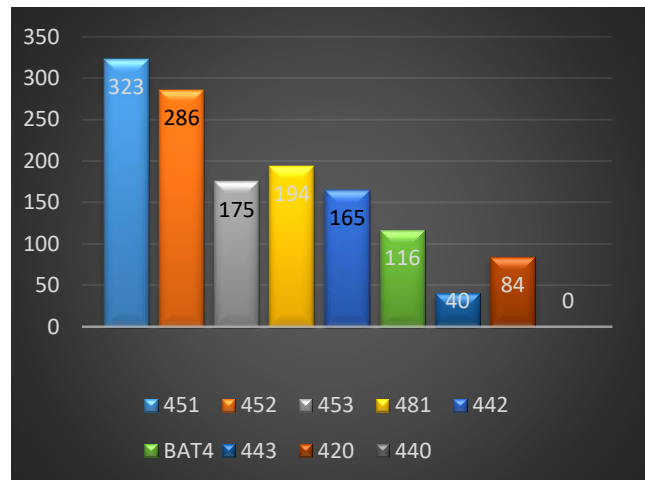
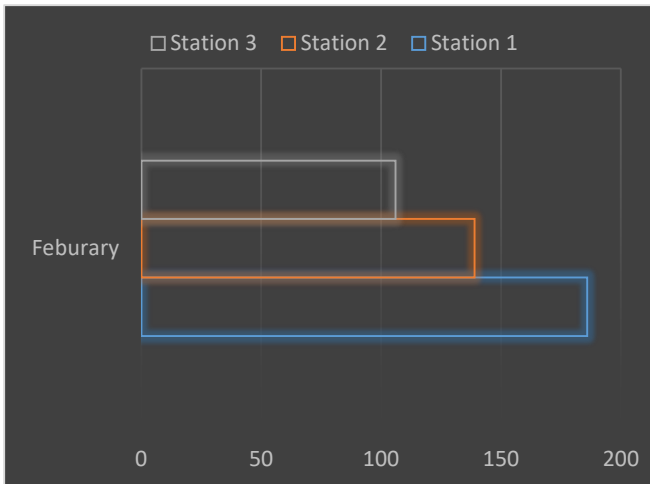

2024 Total call volume- 955 | 2023-886 (+)69

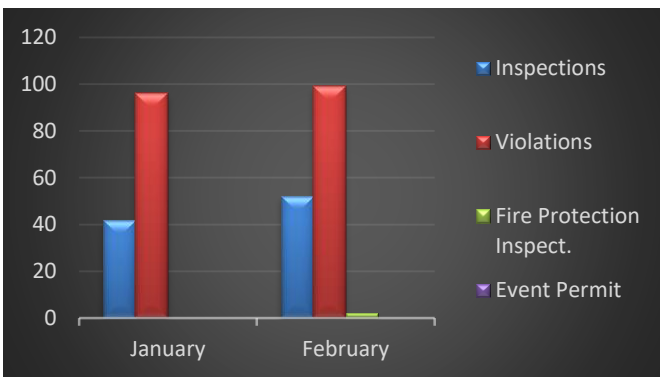
Call volume by month- 431 | 2023- 494

Work Orders & Preventative Maintenance

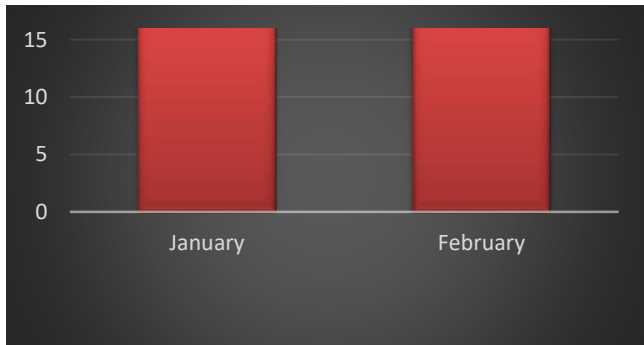
- A total of 85 work orders have been completed along with two preventative maintenance services.

Fire Suppression & Training-Reported by Battalion Chief Williams

1,148 hours were spent on fire training which focused on fire behavior. On average, each firefighter trained 19.1 hours this month.

Week 1 Ice Rescue Techniques

Crews responded to a “victim on the ice” and located a subject who fell through the ice. Under the supervision of our dive team, crews worked through the methods of rescuing the subject.

Week 2 Palmer’s Doll House Fires

Lt. Weir provided training on fire behavior utilizing a Palmer’s Doll House. This was a great opportunity for crews to see the impact of door control, flow paths, fire behavior and general dynamics in a controlled setting.

Week 3 Fire Suppression Tactics in Single Family Homes

Crews trained on the fastest way to remove the turnout gear from a firefighter suffering a cardiac arrest with minimal interruption to compressions.

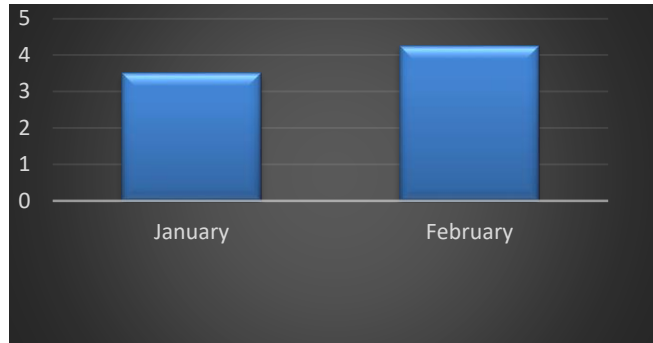
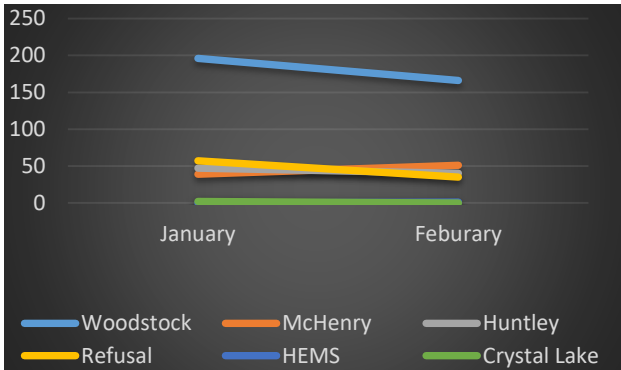

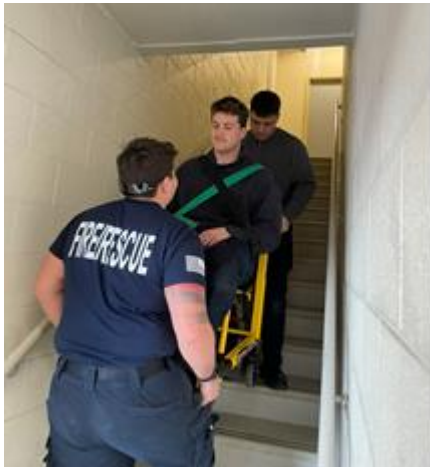

EMS Training
